Students must have been in foster care for the 12 consecutive months leading up to and including their 18th birthday or have been adopted or placed in legal guardianship from foster care after their 16th birthday or must have been orphaned for the last one year at the time of their 18th birthday. They also must be accepted to accredited, Pell-eligible college and be under the age of 25 on March 31. Students must have been in foster care or orphaned while living in the United States. U.S. citizenship is not required. Awards range from \$2,500 - \$5,000 based on a combination of need and merit per academic year.
