- No additional application is required; merit scholarships are awarded at the time of admission based on a holistic view of your portfolio and application materials.

What is the FAFSA?

It is the <u>free</u> Federal Application that student's need to submit each year to be eligible for Federal Financial Aid.

- To apply for federal student aid, such as federal grants, work-study, and loans, you need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- In addition, many states and colleges like SAIC use your FAFSA information to determine your eligibility for need based state and school aid.





- Student's must submit a FAFSA each academic year in which Financial Aid is sought.
- Students must be a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen -- International Students do not submit a FAFSA.
- Dependent students, in accordance with Federal Student Aid, must also include their parents information on their FAFSA Application as a "Contributor".
- The 2025-26 FAFSA became available to complete in November 21, 2024.

Secure an FSA ID before submitting

- Students and Contributors will not be able to access the FAFSA form without an FSA ID set up prior to starting the form.
- An FSA ID is a username and password you need to access Federal Student Aid Applications.
- Remember, the FSA ID is unique and the student and contributor (usually Parent or student's Spouse)should have their very own. <u>Do not mix them up</u>.
- Please be sure to <u>remember your FSA ID</u>; you will need it again in the future. <u>Write it down in a secure place!</u>

What happens next?

- The student will receive a email from Federal Student Aid within 3 days after the FAFSA is submitted.
- <u>READ</u> that email and share it with your contributors (Parent or Student's Spouse) as applicable.
- Your FAFSA information is shared with the colleges you list on the application. (up to 20 colleges can be added)
- Schools uses your information to determine how much aid you may receive at that individual school.
- Other schools might also have other forms for you to fill out

The FAFSA is the only Financial Aid Form needed at SAIC.

saic School of the Art Institute What is the result of the FAFSA?

If your FAFSA is complete, the student will be notified of the results of the FAFSA – Student Aid Index (SAI)

Schools use the SAI to determine your federal student aid eligibility and financial aid award.

Your SAI is not the amount of money you will have to pay for college nor is it the amount of federal student aid you will receive. It is the number used by Federal Student Aid and your school to calculate the amount of aid you are eligible to receive.

Financial Aid Award Offe<mark>r</mark>

- Once SAIC receives your SAI from your submitted FAFSA, we will use it to determine your eligibility for Financial Assistance and provide you with a Award Offer.
- > Your Financial Aid Award may contain:
 - Scholarships and Grants (free money)
 - Merit Scholarships from SAIC
 - Need Based Grants

- Federal Work-Study Eligibility (earned money)
 - Based on need (SAI)
- Federal Student Loans (must be paid back)
 - Federal Direct Stafford Loans
 - Eligibility for <u>credit based</u> Federal Direct Parent PLUS Loans
- Eligibility for Private Loans (must be payed back)
 - ▶ If you choose not to access Federal Direct Parent PLUS Loans. Also <u>credit based</u>.

SAIC will begin providing Financial Aid Award Notifications beginning in Mid/Late-January 2025
