- Pursue exhibition, residency, fellowship, and funding opportunities.
- Learn about contemporary practices in emerging creative industries, freelancing, and self-employment.

ADVISING

CAPX works with all degree-seeking undergraduate students, graduate students, and alums at all professional levels and tailors advising to serve individual needs, identifying strengths and values. Our professional staff, faculty, and student peer advisors provide personalized advising sessions to help prepare students to pursue rewarding career paths.

Undergraduate Students

CAPX provides career advising, programming, and resources on professional development opportunities for undergraduate students from their first year through graduation and beyond.

Graduate Students

CAPX offers career advising and facilitates workshops for graduate students on preparing to apply for college teaching positions, writing grant proposals, and more.

Handshake

Handshake is a college-to-career platform that includes CAPX-approved internships; full-time, part-time, and contract and freelance jobs; and on-campus jobs. Students and alums can also use Handshake to schedule advising appointments, register for events, and access resources for career readiness.

Jobs and Internships

CAPX works closely with employers at the forefront of creative industries to provide career and internship opportunities for students and alums. Over the years, we've partnered with more than 2,000 local, national, and international employers and internship providers.

Internship & Career Fair

CAPX hosts an in-person fair in the fall and spring semesters with more than 40 employers in attendance at each event. All students and alums are invited to connect with leading companies and organizations from across the country to explore internship and job opportunities.
